Walking While Waiting –

By definition waiting rooms are want-to-be-elsewhere places. You want to be talking with the doctor, hearing the surgeon say your S.O. is in recovery, and seeing your car driven out of the shop. This advent season we will be hearing God's word and what God would say about our waiting rooms. We will be walking through these days knowing that we are not exempt from the same emotional struggles of those who have gone before. Those who asked: when, oh God, when?

We celebrate Advent with Christians of 100s of years, generations and generations before us, because we must remember – our spiritual lives are dependent on remembering - that to live faithfully is to live hopefully and to live hopefully is to live “waitingly.” We do not hope for what we already have. As generations waited for a savior, as Mary waited to give birth, we wait to see what God is causing to be born in our lives in our church.

Scripture tells us how to sit in the waiting room, and it's not to sit at all; or at least not to sit inattentively. The consistent lesson of wisdom is to walk while you wait. When the light doesn't fall on the horizon, look at the light which lights your path and take the next step. Walk as a child of the light, even when it seems like darkness reigns.

On Sunday I quoted Saul Bellow who in a letter said: “... I've never stopped looking for the real thing; and often I find the real thing. To fall into despair is just a high-class way of turning into a dope.”

Despair is not an option for those of faith. The real thing is there. With faithfulness and in God's time, we'll find it. But the “it” may always be different from our expectations.

Jeff Bridges won an Oscar last year for his portrait of an old washed up country singer. For sometime I've appreciated his acting and wasn't surprised to read that he was described as, “the most natural and least self-conscious screen actor who ever lived.” When asked about this, and how he does it in the middle of the chaos of making a film, this is what he said: “How can I describe it? You prepare. You do your due diligence, and then you come and it's completely different. It's rainy when it's supposed to be sunny. The director's [mad]. The other actor's not doing it the way you imagined. It's like you're all set to do a Viennese waltz and you show up to find a cha-cha band. You can spend your energy getting [mad] or you can dance the cha-cha.”

The life of faith: waiting, walking, and dancing to the music we hear, not always the music we expected.

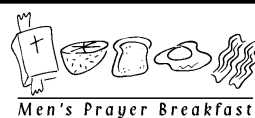
